#### Jack Breslin to be Admitted to Hall of Fame at Boat Club Dinner

**Jacweir "Jack" Breslin** (1920 -1988) has been admitted into the Michigan Irish American Hall of Fame in the sports category by our club's Board, which governs the Hall of Fame.

A native of Battle Creek, Michigan, Jack Breslin was a star athlete in football, basketball, and baseball at Michigan State University in the 1940's. He earned six varsity letters and the MVP award in football. After graduation from MSU, he served in many positions at MSU, including as a Vice-President of the University. Through his advocacy for MSU he became known as "Mr. MSU," and he received several honors from MSU, such as The Duffy Daugherty Award, the Distinguished Faculty Award, and a Doctorate of Law. The Breslin Center at MSU is named after him. He served on numerous boards of

public and charitable organizations, and the Jack and Renee Breslin Cancer Center in Ingham County is named as a memorial to Jack Breslin and his wife, **Renee Breslin**.

Although each year's inductees are usually going to be admitted to the Hall of Fame at a ceremony during our annual music festival in September, Jack Breslin's son, **Brian Breslin**, who will accept this honor on behalf of the Breslin family, has a schedule conflict that prevents him from being available then. For that reason, we will induct his father into the Hall of Fame at our dinner on August 29 at the Mona Lake Boating Club. Brian Breslin is the Vice-Chair of the Michigan State University Board of Trustees. This will be a great event to invite MSU alumni and supporters to attend!
